

2009 Facts and Figures

- ✦ This **RESCUE SQUAD** is a group of volunteers that provide 24-hour emergency service for the search and rescue of lost victims on water and land and aid to disaster victims. (Lake Martin United Way)
- ✦ ALABAMA HEAD INJURY FOUNDATION serves Alabamians disabled by traumatic brain injury or spinal cord injury through case management, financial aid, respite care, housing assistance, and social/recreational programs. (Community Health Charities)
- ✦ TENNESSEE VALLEY REHABILITATION CENTER offers vocational training to disabled persons to increase their chances of finding jobs. (North Central Alabama)
- ✦ COLUMBUS HOSPICE OF ALABAMA is a home health care program designed to care for those faced with life-threatening disease and to make the best of what time remains for the patient and family. Phenix City location serves Alabama families in Lee and Russell counties. (UW of Chattahoochee Valley)
- ✦ The **Steering Committee** consists of a chair, appointed by the Governor, and 6 members from all 3 branches of state government, who oversee the campaign.
- ✦ ALABAMA BLUES PROJECT teaches at-risk children life-skills and cultural self-esteem through a blues music curriculum taught by accomplished Alabama Blues Musicians. (West Alabama)
- ✦ JUVENILE DIABETES RESEARCH FOUNDATION INTERNATIONAL, ALABAMA CHAPTER seeks to save lives of children and adults, through research, who suffer from diabetes and its devastating complications. (Community Health Charities)
- ✦ ETOWAH COMMUNITY FREE CLINIC sponsors the Prescription Resource Network program which accesses free prescription medications for citizens who cannot afford to buy prescribed medicines. (Etowah & Cherokee Counties)
- ✦ HELEN KELLER INTERNATIONAL works to save the sight and lives of the most vulnerable and disadvantaged; combats the causes and consequences of blindness and malnutrition. (Global Impact)
- ✦ GREATER BIRMINGHAM HABITAT FOR HUMANITY, INC. builds quality, affordable houses in partnership with low-income families. Prepares qualifying families for homeownership and offers continued family development resources after homeownership. (Central Alabama)
- ✦ CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OF ALABAMA is Alabama's only free-standing hospital dedicated solely to the care and treatment of children, with 13,777 inpatient and 629,909 outpatient visits in 2007. (Statewide and Local Unaffiliated Agency)
- ✦ NORTHWEST ALABAMA READING AIDES, INC. teaches adults how to read in a confidential atmosphere on a one-to-one basis. This service is free, and morning and evening classes are available. (Shoals)
- ✦ UNITED METHODIST CHILDREN'S HOME helps help children and families through spiritual, social, physical, and educational opportunities including residential and foster care, adoption services, and family support programs. (Statewide and Local Unaffiliated Agency)
- ✦ AUTAUGA/WESTERN ELMORE ASSOCIATION FOR RETARDED CITIZENS prepares adults with mental retardation for fullest possible participation in their community. Provides an adult residential program and early intervention for children with disabilities, ages 0-3. (River Region United Way)
- ✦ The **State Combined Campaign** is the only authorized payroll deduction charitable fundraising effort for state employees.
- ✦ AUBURN DAY CARE CENTER is a United Way, nationally accredited agency, providing comprehensive child care services that are affordable and accessible enabling parents to work or attend school. (UW of Lee County)
- ✦ ALABAMA CHILD CARING FOUNDATION provides immediate medical care and on-going medical coverage for needy, uninsured children who are not eligible for governmental programs. (Statewide)
- ✦ CARE ASSURANCE SYSTEM FOR THE AGING, also known as C.A.S.A., recruits, trains and motivates volunteers who minister to physical and social needs of homebound and aging persons, which enables them to remain at home. (Jackson & Madison Counties)
- ✦ BAY AREA FOOD BANK, INC. America's Second Harvest affiliate distributing donated food through nonprofit agencies and churches in 24 Florida, Alabama, and Mississippi Gulf Coast counties to those in need. (Southwest Alabama)
- ✦ The SABRA Sanctuary provides shelter and assistance to abused women and their children. (Selma/Dallas United Way)
- ✦ CALHOUN COUNTY RSVP coordinates volunteer opportunities for persons over 55 including orientation and placement for 43 different non-profit community service programs, agencies and organizations. (East Central Alabama)
- ✦ ENTERPRISE YMCA is a Christian organization that offers programs to underprivileged children in pre-school after school day care, youth sports and physical fitness. (Wiregrass)
- ✦ CHRISTIAN CHILDREN'S FUND is an international, humanitarian organization dedicated to the development and survival of children worldwide regardless of race, nationality, gender, or religion. (Global Impact)
- ✦ C.I.T.Y. PROGRAM OF CHILTON COUNTY CHARITABLE TRUST is a program is for high-risk adolescents, ages 12-17, referred by Juvenile Court, DHR, Mental Health, or the schools. The program offers academic, social, employment, behavior/motivational training, and counseling. (Chilton County UW)
- ✦ Campaign Goal for 2008 is \$800,000.
- ✦ Known as LARC, the Local Area Review Committee is comprised of State Employees in the 10 geographical areas of Alabama, whose primary purpose is to review applications submitted by agencies and federations that wish to be considered for participation in the annual SCC, prior to final action by the Steering Committee.
- ✦ While the Law was enacted in 1991 and took effect in 1992, the first Alabama State Employee Combined Charitable Campaign (ASECCC) was held in 1993.
