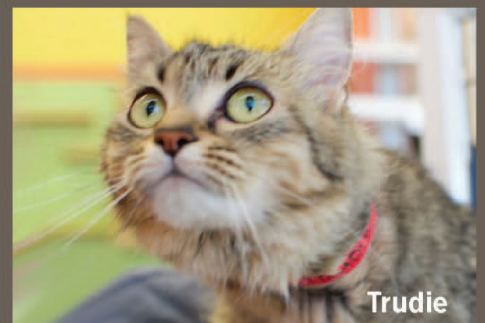

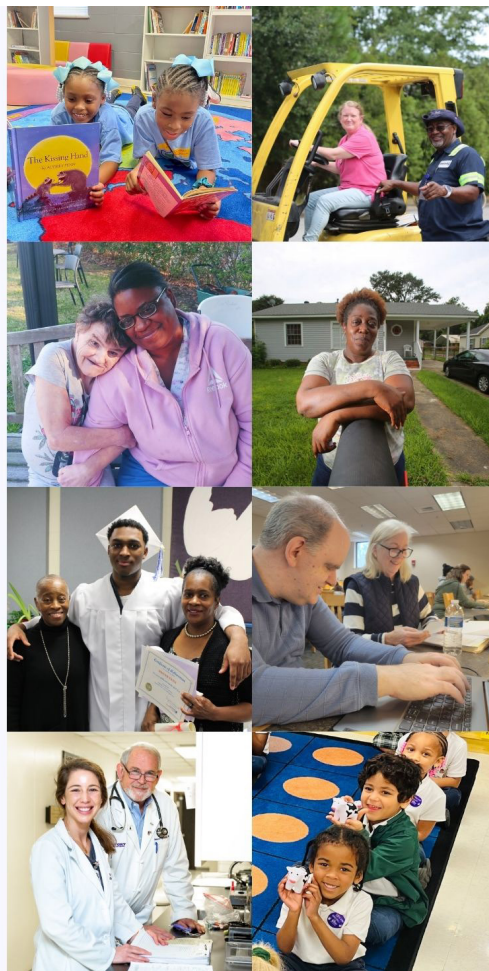

The SCC Makes Giving Easy!

The State Combined Campaign (SCC) is the only authorized workplace campaign for state employees in Alabama.

It is the only way State Employees can support charitable organizations through the ease of payroll deduction.

Since 1993, Alabama's State Employees have contributed **over \$22 million** to SCC charitable organizations!

1. Choose an agency to which you wish to give. You may search our online database at <http://www.statecombinedcampaign.org/charities/>. You may choose from organizations providing services in the local areas listed or organizations providing services on a state-wide or international basis.
2. If your favorite charity is not listed, contact the SCC office. We may be able to help.
3. For each charitable organization, a brief description of services provided by the agency, its phone number, 6-digit agency code and the percent of overhead is given.
4. You are encouraged to designate your gift. Undesignated contributions will be distributed among participating agencies in the same proportion they received designated contributions.
5. Complete your pledge card along with the TOTAL dollar amount you want to go to each agency and or federation.
6. You can give by payroll deduction (the easiest way to give!), cash, check, or credit card.
7. **Payroll deduction:** be sure to provide your employee ID (which can be found on your paystub)
8. **Cash or check:** Just turn in along with your pledge form to your Coordinator or Keyworker.
9. **Credit card:** You will find instructions along with a convenient way to give at <http://www.statecombinedcampaign.org/credit-card-donations/>. You must complete a pledge form and please be sure to include the transaction ID, so that we can easily match up your gift!
10. If you would like to designate your gift to a specific program or would like to make it honoring someone, please attach the **Earmark/Memorial Contribution Form** found at <http://www.statecombinedcampaign.org/earmark-form> or contact the SCC office or your Statewide Coordinator for the form.
11. Print your email/address on the pledge card if you want to hear from the agency(ies) to whom you designated your gift (\$25 minimum please).
12. Forward your pledge card either to your Statewide Coordinator or Keyworker. You can also email or mail your pledge form to the SCC office at hbutler@unitedwaysal.org or PO Box 1228, Montgomery, AL 36102.

- \$5 can purchase one membership registration for a child at the Boys and Girls Clubs of the River Region.
- \$20 provides preventive vaccinations for 2 puppies at Montgomery Humane Society.
- \$25 Buys a birthday gift for the child of an incarcerated mother at Aid to Inmate Mothers (AIM)
- \$25 covers one monthly bus pass for one student at Hope Inspired Ministries.
- \$25 provides a book bag and 5 books to help start a Pre-K student's library at United Way of Central Alabama.
- \$25 will buy milk/food for a week for a child at Brantwood Children's Home
- \$25 Provide funds for a client in CCAP to participate in a weekly art class with an artist
- \$35 supports a foster child for one week at Agape of Central Alabama.
- \$50 provides a month's supply of diapers to a military family at March of Dimes.
- \$50 provides some personal hygiene products for young people at the Alabama Sheriffs Youth Ranches.
- \$83 provides a night of emergency shelter for individuals forced to flee their home due to violence at Family Sunshine Center.
- \$100 provides 10 kids with dental services, exams, cleanings, referrals, procedures, and surgeries at Children International.
- \$100 can purchase Comfort Medications for a patient for 2 weeks at Hospice of Montgomery.
- \$100 will cover the cost of one dog adoption at the Elmore County Humane Society.
- \$100 will supply 22 people with diabetic medicine for six months at Blessings International.
- \$100 allows a child a world of learning and relationship building in our summer youth camp program at Prattville YMCA.
- \$125 provides 1 forensic interview at Butterfly Bridge Children's Advocacy Center.
- \$140 provides one month's worth of meals to a homebound senior citizen at Meals on Wheels Montgomery.
- \$150-\$400 provides a breast cancer patient/survivor a custom-fit medical grade compression sleeve at Women of Hope.
- \$200 provides a pregnancy test and ultrasound appointment at First Choice for a woman considering her pregnancy options.
- \$600 provides a custom mobility harness for a child or veteran receiving a mobility assistance trained service dog at Service Dog Alabama.

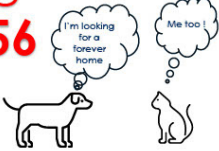

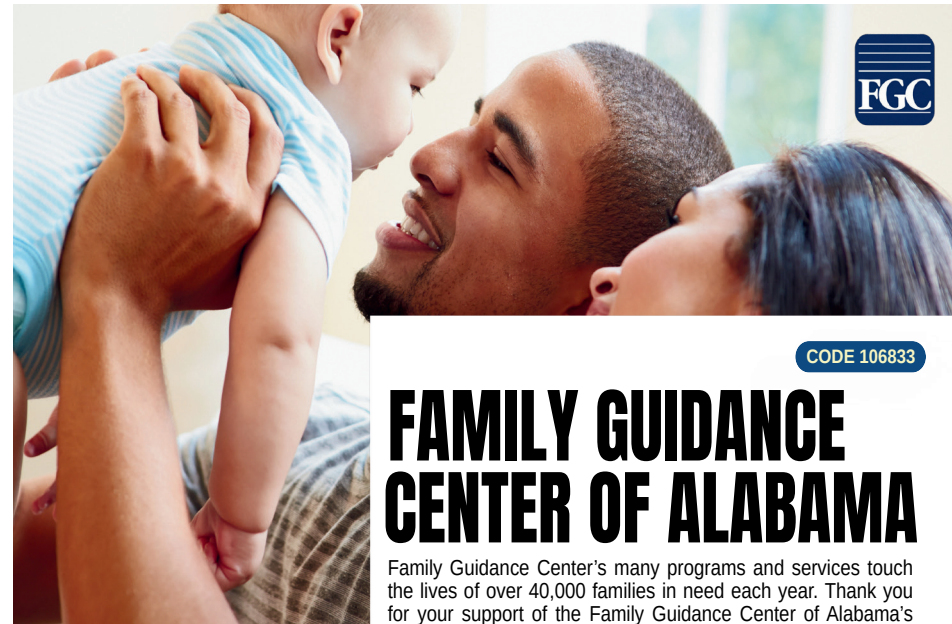

Since opening in 2021, SHELL Health has grown to serve more than 1,800 patients, and we're still expanding. Coming soon in 2026, SHELL Health will open an in-house pharmacy, creating a convenient one-stop location for HIV and STI testing, treatment, and medications. Patients will be able to pick up their prescriptions immediately after their appointments.

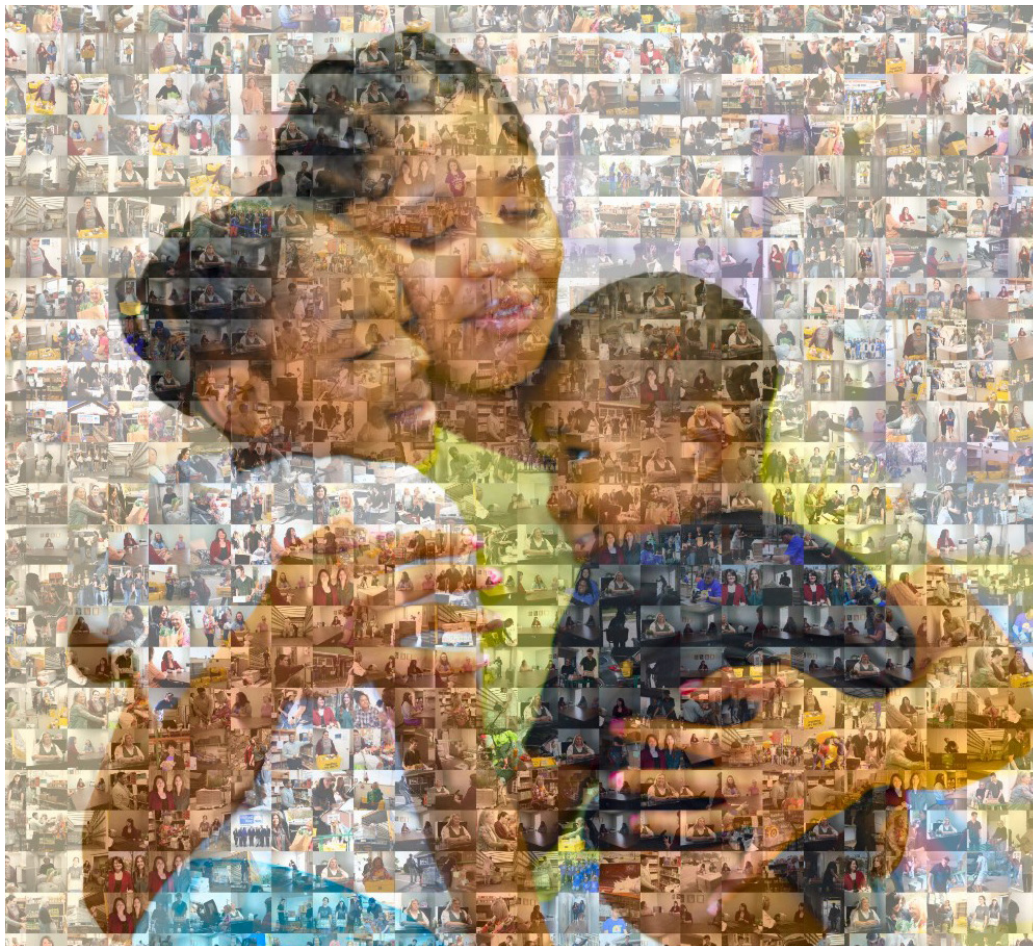
